

# PRELUDE WELCOME

Welcome to all here in the sanctuary, in the parking lot and at home on this 4th Sunday of Lent. Today, is often called "Laetere Sunday" or "Rejoice Sunday." It marks a turning point, half way through Lent. We rejoice in our commitment to walking with Christ through our Lenten practices of doing with less, giving more, leaning on the Word, and learning to know ourselves. As we turn a corner in our journey today we pray for protection from evil and look expectantly to the light of Easter Resurrection.

This 4th Sunday is also the Sunday before St. Patrick's Day so we rejoice in the Celtic affirmation that Christ came not to condemn but to save and bring us freedom and joy. Part of our liturgy today is derived from early Christian Celtic worship and prayers of St. Patrick.





the communion of saints,


the forgiveness of sins,


