





Some people ask about observing the 40 days, honoring Christ's temptations in the wilderness, with fasting or going off a favorite food, Facebook or internet game. Lent began with Ash Wednesday. The ELCA Church, along with many other Protestant denominations is a 'Resurrection Church.' Each Sunday celebrates the resurrection and new life in Christ. Many Lutherans begin the 40 days observance on Ash Wednesday so that 'fasting' occurs on all days except Sundays; Sunday remains a day of joy and celebration. If you want to observe the 40 days but didn't get a start on Ash Wednesday discern the best way for you to do this. Even embarking on this discipline in a way that fits your schedule is worthwhile. You will improve and grow with its meaning each year.
