\* Due to the budget impasse this summer, St. John's Pre-K Counts preschool program along with schools and colleges across PA, are still awaiting funding from the state. The daycare has been paying the Pre-K salaries and other expenses until the monies are paid out, which should be this month according to the last update. The net income figure will decrease once funding has been received.

#### St. John's Knotters

Walk into our church library on a given Thursday morning, and there you will find a small group of women standing over one of the tables talking, laughing...and knotting. These women are St. John's Knotters. No one is certain when the knotters group began, but our earliest directory in 1985 includes a picture of several women in the blue room/library standing over a quilt frame. Today the women still meet there, on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays from September thru May, weather permitting.

Each quilt takes five to six hours to complete, with members contributing a certain skill. While the sewing is done by some of the women with that talent, it takes the "combined efforts" of everyone involved to see each one through to completion.

Patches which have been cut and ironed are laid out to create a pattern which consists of 11 rows, with 8 patches per row. Numbered stickers are attached to each patch and they are placed in a box for sewing. The patches are sewn together by rows, which are then trimmed and assembled by row to complete the comfort top. An iron is run over them again, before being brought up to the church where they are matched with a back and placed in the cupboard to be knotted.

On knotting day, sets are selected. A pre-cut piece of batting is placed between the top and bottom piece and clamped to a table. At this point, the ladies present gather around the tables, their fingers pushing the needle in and out, as each 8" square patch is knotted. The top and batting are evenly trimmed, and the top is measured to give a 2" binding and trimmed accordingly. The binding is then sewn around the comfort.

Each of the finished comforts is functional and beautiful, with no two alike. Much of the material used for the patches and backs is donated, or picked up at yard sales and thrift stores. During the year, large rolls of batting are purchased at a local Dry Goods store. On average, twelve pieces of filler are measured and cut from each roll. Nothing useable is ever thrown away.

Boxes for packing normally come from Valley View and/or Sharp Shopper. Volunteers throughout the years have transported them to various locations. They are then sent on to the Lutheran World Relief Distribution Center, in New Windsor, Maryland until needed. No one knows where they will end up and who the recipients will be.

St. John's Knotters have turned quilting into a mission -- and a ministry. It is obvious that they are serving God, and their purpose is to show others that God loves them - in the gift of a quilt. When you have been the victim of a devastating war, hurricanes, or other disaster and literally have nothing, the gift of a comfort can be everything.
