



*CONFESSION and FORGIVENESS





St. John's ~ Income \$ 189,498.02 Expense \$ 198,438.35 *Net Income \$ -8,940.33 *As authorized by the 2023 budget, \$5,000.00 was transferred from the money market account to cover expenses.

Daycare ~ Income \$ 240,370.76 Expense \$ 263,020.78 *Net Income \$ -22,650.02

* Due to the budget impasse this summer, St. John's Pre-K Counts preschool program along with schools and colleges across PA, are still awaiting funding from the state. The daycare has been paying the Pre-K salaries and other expenses until the monies are paid out, which should be this month according to the last update. The net income figure will decrease once funding has been received.
