*As authorized by the 2023 budget, \$5,000.00 was transferred from the money market account to cover expenses.

Daycare ~ Income \$ 244,282.32 Expense \$ 263,020.78 *Net Income \$ -18,738.46

* Due to the budget impasse this summer, St. John's Pre-K Counts preschool program along with schools and colleges across PA, have not received their funding from the state. The daycare has been paying the Pre-K salaries and other expenses. Last Monday, we were notified that funding will be released on the 23rd and checks distributed on the 24th. The net income figure will decrease once funding has been received.
