The November newsletter can be found in the mailboxes of those members who do not receive it by email.

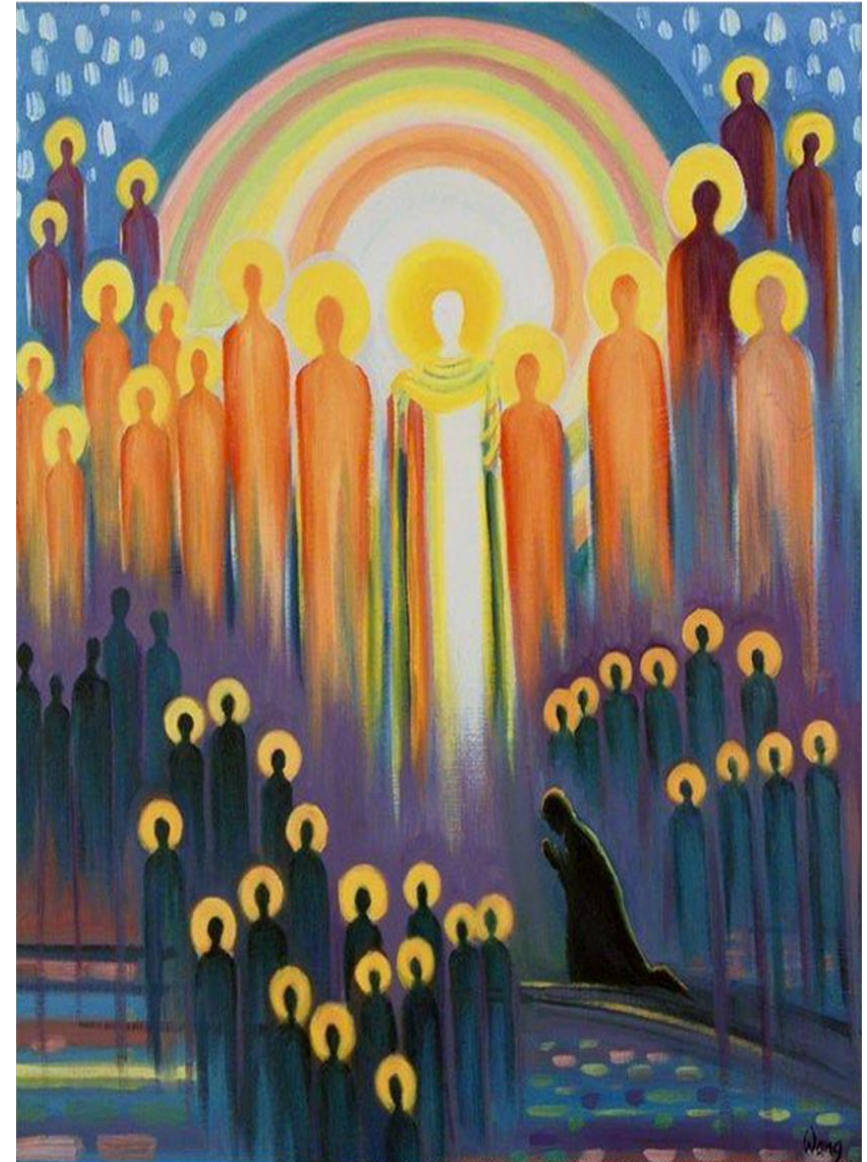
