

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Since we are at the beginning of Advent, it is a little early to wish you a Merry Christmas. Come to our service of worship on Christmas Eve and I will wish you a Merry Christmas and bid you farewell.

Christmas eve will be the last time I lead worship for St. John's as your interim pastor. I made the decision to retire again effective January 1, 2019, not knowing whether St. John's would have a newly called pastor by then. I still do not know, but after three years it is time for me to move on.

You have been gracious in overlooking the mistakes I made in leading worship as I was unfamiliar with the order of worship here. You kept me well informed about the people of St. John's and how we could minister to them. We shared joy and sorrow and God's love. I trust you will do the same with your next pastor whether another interim or a regularly called pastor.

In Advent our lives are filled with expectation of the coming again of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We prepare to celebrate His birth with hymns of praise, candlelight, and Holy Communion. We give gifts to each other as reminders of God's generosity in giving us Jesus. In our Advent preparations and Christmas celebrations we are reminded that all we do as God's people is based on God's love for us in Jesus Christ. What we do here and in our lives is to reflect that love.

I hope that you have seen and experienced God's love in my ministry with you. I know I have felt an outpouring of God's love from the people of St. John's and I trust your next pastor will as well.

We still have a month of ministry together. I will continue to pray for you and this ministry. May God bless your life together, strengthen you with the Holy Spirit, and guide your serving in Jesus' name.

### **Property**

An electric wall unit heater was recently installed in the nursery. Instead of heating the main floor, each of the rooms used throughout the week now have electric heat. The basement classrooms remain warmer since they are mostly underground.

The thermostat which had been in the nursery has been placed on the wall across from the church office. It is set at 57 degrees aside from Sunday morning. It will only call for heat on the main floor when the temperature drops below.

This should go a long way in helping to keep our fuel oil usage and winter heating cost down.

*Matthew 25: Ministries* accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. Our pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

### Acceptable collection items include:

Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles

Large and small pill bottles

Pill Bottles with and without secure caps (child resistant)

### All bottles must have:

Labels removed leaving no glue or residue.

Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.

Rinse and dry thoroughly.

Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments of medical supplies are recycled for cash that goes towards *Matthew 25: Ministries*' programs.

This ministry is supported by West Kish Presbyterian. A box for your pill bottle donations can be found in the coat room area beside the narthex.

Sadly, Mifflin County has families who are homeless. We may not see them, but they are here. Families do not choose to be homeless, many are similar to other families that are also poor, but who have a home to live in. They may be struggling with incomes that are far less than they need to pay for housing, or their situation may be due to a lost job or work hours, conflict with family members they are staying with, or even violence within the home. Unfortunately, many of the homeless are children, and students in our schools.

Mifflin County School District has a 'Supply Pantry' which helps provide personal care, school supplies, and undergarments to students in need. The daycare is collecting items as a Christmas outreach project. If you would like to help, a box has been placed in the coatroom area outside the office.
