I don't know about you, but for me summer has always meant adventure and time to be in the water. From a wash tub or wading pools in the backyard, to catching crawdads in the viaduct, to public park swimming lessons, country club diving lessons, standing under a waterfall at Lindenlure Missouri, inner tubing on the Arkansas river, and dodging waves of the Atlantic in Maine, I was in the water most the summer. And now we have water parks and stay at home Jacuzzi's capitalizing on the joy of being moved by and immersed in water.

In the Church the Baptismal font is our go-to for the revitalizing, freeing, joyful celebration of the water of Life. The Bible, the font and the Communion table are the three primary sources and signs of our Protestant faith: the Word and the two Sacraments.

Many of us have baptismal gowns handed down from generation to generation, or pictures of them, stored away in our attic. But the reality of our Baptism is not meant to be stored away but lived every day. What does this mean? What's the how-to? There are so many things to be immersed in out there in our society today, games at State College, sales at the Mall, weather and world events; so many things to be immersed in in our busy lives of family, community, and church; so many things to be immersed in in our minds and hearts - losses, regrets, intentions, irritations.

When we find ourselves lost in a whirlpool of worries or diversions cycling 'round our mind can we just stop and remember our Baptism, our immersion in Christ? When we're feeling a little hot headed can we pause to remember that cool and perhaps startling wake-up of the Baptismal water poured upon us? If we can even momentarily go down in the river of Prayer and ask Christ to help us we will begin to feel released.

As you play in the water this summer or even enjoy a relaxing bath or shower - think for a moment of the joy of your Baptism. That one spark of joy can have a magnifying, positive effect on your life and those around you.

Pick up a pebble on your travels or from the font at church and think about all the eons of water and waves that have smoothed that stone. Thank God for working upon us, accepting and holding and transforming the rough spots in our lives. Thank Christ for the saving grace of his death and resurrection and for the Holy Spirit that works with us, works on us making us all smooth, water-worked stones in the hand of God. Remember in your giving the many agencies that bring wells to people without access to water, and the Gospel to those who have not known Christ.

Remember your Baptism. Have fun in the water! Have a blessed summer.

Thank you to everyone who donated to the Donovan and Heather Kanagy family. A total of \$1,050.00 was sent to them.


We continue to pray for God's peace, comfort, patience and healing.
