This 12th month of the year proclaims three new creations, three new beginnings and all are found in the picture of the Nativity. This one drawn by my sister Joan, shows Joseph with his staff scratching the head of the gentle lamb, as the Christ Child points to Mary. Mary, who has held the news of the coming Christ in her body and soul, now joyfully communicates with the baby Jesus with attentive wonder and care.

December 1 this year is the first day of Advent, the beginning of our Church Year, where we too look forward with Hope and anticipation to the coming of the Messiah, to Christ's presence on Earth. Our 2019 Advent Devotional book provides a scripture reading and a community member's reflection and prayer for every day leading up to Christmas. A way, for us too, to communicate with, nurture and to be attentive to Jesus in our lives.

Christmas itself is a First Day, the day Christ was born, issuing in a whole new world and the beginnings of the formation of the church. As the church we can remember our special Holy Week events, the hundreds at the Sky Family revival, meaningful funeral lunch gatherings, the beautiful knotters quilts, communions at Valley View, welcoming a new Day Care Director, Liberian and community outreach, while honoring the many ways the leadership and mission of the church have worked together to shape our future.

Taking time for quiet this season, taking time to reflect on the beauty of God's creation dusted with snow, to read devotionals and scripture or talk to your pastor (!) may result in yet a 4th new creation. A new realization, a new creation, a new joy may spring forth from the root of Jesse in you. This season may the gift of Christ's love come gently, unexpectedly, surprisingly chosen, wrapped up and given just for you.

Bring one or two of your favorite table games and see if others would like to play it. Maybe someone else will bring a game you will want to play. Come and join in the fun!




