Lent, the 40 days leading up to Easter, is a time for reflection and evaluation not only of ourselves but of our church and our world. Lent is a time, personally and communally, to think about and act on what we truly value. We realize what we value most is life. We are reminded of the ultimate value of Christ in our lives, Christ who went to the cross for us and was raised to bring us new life and eternal life.

From the very beginning of Lent, we are humbled by this great gift. When we hear those words on Ash Wednesday from Genesis 3:19 : "Remember that dust you are, and to dust you shall return," and are blessed and branded with that ashen cross, we are reminded of our own mortality. As we look around to those gathered and we see that same cross, reflected in face of others we may be moved to great love for all humanity and for our church which allows us to see ourselves as we are. Penitence is not a matter of self blaming and finger pointing, but of being accepting of ourselves and compassionate towards others' failings and strivings as well. We are reminded that everyone around us, (even your pastor) is human.


Barbara Blodgett, Associate Dean of Assessment at Pittsburgh Seminary, writes in her 2020 Lenten reflection - speaking to all leaders in the church:

Ministry is many things. On the negative side, it's often lonely, difficult, prone to fostering feelings of inauthenticity. Ministry is lonely, not in the sense..vou aren't with other people, but sometimes you're the only one in your particular role. ... You're spread thin, busy with so many different responsibilities toward so many people.

I, though, would not describe my ministry here as 'lonely.' Busy, yes, but at both churches people are so moved by the Spirit, invested in and involved in worship and mission in the community, ministry has always felt, as it should be, like a shared endeavor. It's apparent there has been a variety of expectations for the pastor role and for others leading in ministry in the church and as a result a variety of evaluations as we all seek to align our day to day lives with the Gospel.

As for inauthenticity, Blodgett adds: "How hard it is to convey the meaning of the cross and the resurrection! When people look to us as the expert"... and, I might add, you know you're just another Christian with a cross on your forehead, and on your heart. Authenticity of testimony is fostered as each person takes that walk with Christ themselves supported by the fellowship of the church. Our Ash Wednesday all day Prayer Vigil at West Kish and 7:00 evening service at St. John's help to facilitate this.

This Lent let's reflect, accept, and evaluate where we place our values and how they shape our life and our ministry in the world. Let's be open to sharing this while extending our trust in and love for others. Let's be always asking, "What is God doing and what is God calling us to do?" Let's be ever thankful for God's grace and the beautiful life given us to share in this world and eternity.




Committees

The poster to track donations to pave the parking lot is on display in the Narthex. With your generous support, we are hoping to meet our goal by the time the weather permits us to start the project.





Lutheran Leadings: News from the Synod

Leadership Training: "I will give you knowledge, teaching you the way to go." Psalm 32:8

A free leadership training open to all members of the Synod was offered Feb 1; Joy Byler and Joe Kanagy from our church attended. The Assistant to the Bishop, pastors, lay leaders and church members taught and participated in a day of trainings on a range of topics.

Joy attended workshops on **Finance and Effective Meetings**, confirming many things our council is already on top of like incorporating devotions into each meeting and she also brought back suggestions on finance reporting that we are now incorporating.

Joe attended a session on **Technology and the Church**, a topic which is also the theme of the recent *Living Lutheran* magazine. The council and congregation of St. Johns years ago upgraded the technology of the church to include a wide retractable screen, digital projector and a full sound board.

"Let everyone with ears to hear, listen!" is found at least four times in the Gospel of Mark and Luke. Very recently a new, high-end pastor's head set, and congregant head-sets for those hard of hearing has vastly improved the amplification during our worship services making it possible for everyone to have "ears to hear."

During the past year we have used our tech set up for special events, and to bring video presentations of mission efforts in Armenia, and at Camp Mt. Luther. We have also lifted the Word by bringing professional music and art illustrations into our worship service to expand our lectionary themes. A faith based movie night has been suggested as well. Your feedback and suggestions are appreciated.

Grants Available

Lutheran Advocacy Ministry of PA wants congregations to be aware of a new grant application that is available for non-profits, that includes houses of worship. Governor Wolf announced the availability of \$5 million in funding for security enhancement projects for nonprofit organizations serving diverse communities throughout Pennsylvania and non-profits that principally serve individuals, groups or institutions that are included within a bias motivation category for single bias hate crime incidents as identified by the <u>FBI's 2017</u> <u>Hate Crime Statistics</u> publication. The non-profit security grant applications are available now and will be accepted through February 14, 2020. Applicants can find the <u>application and information about the Program</u> on PCCD's website. Grant awards can range from \$5,000 to \$150,000.
