

Message from the Pastor:

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ."

The Apostle Paul starts each of his letters to his foundling churches with a greeting from God, and follows it with a personalized expression of his gratitude, love and concern for its people. The mutual reliance of the apostle and the people of the church is evident, bound in the fluid and ever present gift of God's Grace and Peace and the responsibility to share that gift with the world.

Ironically, taking time away from our lives in the world, be it a few hours or 40 days, strengthens that commitment. Our Synod supports this practice of group and individual retreat. On Nov 7, Council members will take a small retreat with a synod team to focus on the life of the church. We will prayerfully and pragmatically reflect on our practices pre-Covid, during Covid and into the future.

On a recent retreat at Krislund I woke up in the middle of the night, tossed and turned until I got up. I went out on the porch of the cabin wrapped up in a sleeping bag, sat in the green adirondack chair tilted back to gaze at the heavens. Soon I settled into reflection and prayer. The words of Jesus in Mark from our evening devotional "What do you want me to do for you?" and my response "What do You want me to do for You?" cycled within me as the stars shifted. Finally I seemed to sense a nudge, and taking a deep breath, a sense of peace settled over me.

Asking these questions in moments that you find for prayer during the day may be a good preparation for our retreat whether you are participating or supporting our council in prayer. It may result in a different nudge from for each of us: write letters (as did Paul), slow down, don't hesitate, ask others, take food, care for prisoners. Each nudge from God, considered together, will help move our church forward.

God of our everyday and everything it brings be the light within us that guides each new beginning.

The income and checking account balance figures include the bequest of \$290,421.27 received from the Gladys Mahady Estate which was deposited to non-budget income for the time being.

The expense figure includes the final payment for the parking lot paving \$22,990.00 and \$11,087.96 for the boiler repair.



Open Items


- Washer & Dryer received at Esh's and Richard Yoder will install the electric and plumbing. Approved at prior meeting.

The results and comments will be shared at the December congregational meeting, scheduled for Sunday, December 13.



<u>Approval of Minutes</u> - Motion was made to accept the June 11, 2020 council minutes and minutes taken on July 12 and July 24. Motion was made by Joy Byler and second by John Boring. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report -

Cullingford

- Bill Gullen has been putting a lot of time in audio and tech services beginning with our radio broadcasts. As of late, he is video taping the sermon to upload to our website and facebook. (Our bulliten's are also available on our website.) This brings about starting a Tech support committee to take over these responsibilties. CD's will be made after this Sunday's church service. - Sharing of prayers that our congregation wrote several weeks ago is going well.

- The Day Care finances are back on track after COVID closure. They are receiving COVID monies and Pre K Count funds. A motion was made by Sue Lynch and second by Ed Bilich to resume collecting rent (\$500. monthly) starting the end of September.
- Ed Bilich had asked if they had looked into the Stabler Grants. Carol will ask Lisa to look into these funds.
- Deb French asked that the church/property committee reconsider allowing the Day Care to have a washer and dryer. They are especially needed with the COVID cleaning regulations.
- It was suggested that we get a "push button" lock for the back door. Deb will take this

to the property committee.
