

Hanging on the wall in my office at St. John's is a reproduction of the painting "The Last Supper" with a signature in the left corner "J. Chester 1962." The original "Last Supper" is a mural painted by Leonardo da Vinci for a church and convent in Milan in approximately 1495. Even after 500 years it is one of the world's most recognizable paintings and frequently reproduced.

I called Edna to chat and get a little more information about the painting. She told me her husband John had loved to paint by number. This is one he obviously spent a great deal of time on.

As I looked at it, I could imagine each stroke of the brush and choice of color, the great focus and care it would have taken John to recreate in detail this event in Christ's life.

What a great Lenten or spiritual practice! Intentionally taking time to dwell in the gospel story of Christ's journey to the cross is something we can do by reading the Bible or devotionals or focusing on these stories as depicted in hymns or visual art.

This week as I was thinking about our congregational meeting coming up, I looked up at the painting and saw it as a meeting too. The most poignant message in the painting in terms of the church, of course, is that Christ is at the center, hands extended out to the disciples on both sides.

"The Last Supper" is meant to depict a particular moment of the event as told in John 13 verses 21 and 22: 21 After saying this Jesus was troubled in spirit, and declared, "Very truly, I tell you, one of you will betray me." 22 The disciples looked at one another; uncertain of whom he was speaking."

Some of the disciples and their words are identified in the verses that follow. The painting helps us imagine how the rest of them may have reacted in that moment.

I noticed the gestures, the hands and posture of each disciple, each one different: one pointing to heaven, one in a gesture of alarm, the figure on the left standing on his tip toes with his hands firmly on the table as if to say - 'Wait a minute!' Everyone seems to be talking at once. We see the diversity of their characters from Judas firmly clinging his bag of coins to another seeming to offer patience and wisdom and all of this, with Christ at the center.

If there was a cartoon bubble above each of the disciples, what words would you say each of their gestures depict? Which of the figures do you most identify with? What would you be saying to them?

Take some time with this and pray this Lenten prayer: Forgiving Lord, Even among your chosen disciples one betrayed you. Help me to acknowledge the ways I betray you too. Lead us to be your church as we follow in your footsteps these 40 days. Amen



Minutes of the January 14, 2021 meeting

Mission Statement: We, the members of the St. John's congregation, promise to share the good news of Jesus Christ and love one another through worship and service in our homes, church, community and the world.

Vision Statement: To be welcoming people who encourage God's love in our community through our prayers, devotion, benevolence, and deeds.

The monthly meeting of St. John's Lutheran Church council was held on Thursday, January 14th at 6:30 p.m in the sanctuary.

Present: Pastor Ela Robertson, President Carol Fultz, Ed Bilich, John Boring, Joy Byler, Denise Chester, Sue Lynch, Jami Zook.

Absent: Deb French, Michele Harshbarger

The meeting was called to order by Carol Fultz.

Devotions:

Pastor Ela read scripture from 2 Corinthians, Chapter 5 and followed it up with a message and prayer.

Approval of Minutes:

- The minutes of the December 10, 2020 meeting were presented and accepted without any changes.
- Motion to approve was given by Sue Lynch and 2nd by Denise Chester.

Vote for council officers for 2021:

- After discussion, the following list of officers for 2021 was presented for council approval:
 - o President Carol Fultz
 - Vice President Denise Chester
 - Secretary Joy Byler
 - o Treasurer Ed Bilich
- Motion to approve the officers was given by John Boring and 2nd by Jami Zook

Financial Reports:

- Ed Bilich presented the financial report St. John's
 - o Motion to approve was given by Joy Byler and 2nd by Jami Zook
- Ed Bilich presented the financial report for the Daycare
 - Motion to approve was given by Joy Byler and 2nd by Denise Chester

Pastor's report:

- Pastor Ela went over the report she handed out (attached to the minutes). Notable items were:
 - Item 3 Ed Bilich suggested putting a brochure and newsletter in each of the daycare mailboxes and creating a place for the brochures and future newsletters somewhere downstairs where parents may be encouraged to pick one up and take home.

- O Item 8.6 Denise Chester was asked if she would talk to John Chester about writing up safety procedures for the church regarding a violent act/acts occurring during worship services or other activities at the church. She said she would talk to him and get back to us with his response.
- Item 10 Pastor Ela is looking at the possibility of taking some vacation at the end of January. She has
 not yet confirmed a supply pastor for when she is gone.

Committee Reports:

- Cemetery Denise reported there was 1 traditional burial and 1 cremation in 2020.
- Long Range Joy No report
- Property Deb No report
- Music & Worship Denise
 - o Reba has been our congregational song leader over the past few weeks and will be continuing.
 - Susie Yoo has signed the organist contract.
 - o Carolyn Connor donated her keyboard for Susie to practice on
- Social Ministry Sue
 - o Valentines Day making up candy packages for shut-ins. Hoping to get daycare to help create cards.
- Day Care Carol
 - Daycare will be opening back up this coming Monday, January 18 after quarantining from a teacher being exposed to COVID-19. They have thoroughly cleaned and disinfected everything.
- Finance Ed
 - Distributed a spreadsheet showing the church investments and a recommendation on how to split up the Gladys Mahady Endowment money (\$290,421.47).
 - Thrivent \$100,000 (long term investment and \$50,421.47 (short term investment).
 - Vanguard \$100,000 in the Wellesley Income Fund and \$40,000 in the Wellington Fund.
 - Talked about the meeting some council members had with our Thrivent Rep. Peter Krum and distributed a paper Peter gave us with his recommendation for investing \$50,000
 - \$12,500 in each of these 4 funds; Diversified Income Plus, Opportunity Income Plus, Fixed Income High Yield, and Fixed Income Income
 - Peter is advising initially putting the \$100,421.47 into a money market account where he will then contact us about moving it into other investments as the market stabilizes.
 - After discussion, council decided to take \$10,000 of the \$100,000 originally targeted for the Wellesley Income Fund and putting it into the Emergency Fund account giving us an Emergency Account amount of \$14,503.91
 - Ed said the authorized signatures for our investment funds need to be updated as they have not been revised in years. After discussion, it was decided to give signature authority to the council officers.
 - Motion to approve was given by Sue Lynch and 2nd by Joy Byler
- Safety Carol
 - o After discussion, council decided to amend our COVID safety procedure saying members are to keep their masks on for the entire service. This will also be printed in the bulletin.
- Staff Support Carol & Sue
 - o Met with Pastor Ela. They reported the meeting went very well and was productive
 - o They are now making plans to meet with Kelly and Susie.
 - o They talked to the Daycare staff about keeping their masks on when they go upstairs.
- Christian Ed No report

Old Business:

- Alter Flowers Several Sundays were not signed up for but council members personally filled the vacant spots.
- Parking Lot Service
 - Need box for money envelopes and communion cups
 - o Carol talked about making up a message board that would also include the radio station # 102.3 FM
 - Mount everything to railing at the steps going down to the kitchen

Code Lock Back Door

o Need to find out who installs it and contact them. The Daycare will be paying for the lock.

New Council Members

 We are to have a minimum of 8 members on council. We currently only have 7. A discussion centered on possible people to ask.

Congregational Meeting

The Congregational meeting will be held on February 28.

Christmas Eve Service evaluation

- o Instead of some snow, we got rained on. That forced the men to move inside.
- o It was wonderful to hear the combined men's group from West Kish and St. John's sing.
- o Christmas tree and poinsettias were set up in fellowship hall.
- o 37 people attended

New Business:

· Side door by the coat room

o There has been an issue with the side door leading into the coat room not being locked at all times. We need to get this corrected as it results in a security issue both for the church and the Daycare. Anyone unlocking the door to come into the building should immediately hold the door open and relock it.

Sign-ups for Duties

Carol went through the list of church duties that were currently without having someone assigned.
 Various council members volunteered and all duties now have been assigned.

- It will take manpower to make this happen and that would have to be addressed before anything is purchased.
