Lent reminds us that each day God gives us is precious. We are encouraged in these 40 days to find time to turn inward, to be honest with ourselves, to 'inspect and introspect' and ask forgiveness for attitudes and ways of being that we may not even have realized, are less than or different than what Christ would have us be. This may be a turning point in our lives when we truly sense Christ's love pouring through us and transforming our 'outward glance,' the way we see and respond to the world around us. We are asked to respond with generous compassion to war in the Ukraine, to people experiencing crisis, and loss. Let us be generous with ourselves as well. Some people have asked about the Lenten poem read in the March 20 message. We share it with you here.

On Borrowed Time: A Lenten poem

These Lenten days are loaned to us, set aside – beg, borrow or steal – from winter's numbing latterness - so we remember who we are, have been – might have been and might hope to be. An ancient season, reason to turn inward, to inspect and introspect with a view toward renewal of the outward glance so that, when spring eventually arrives with lilies in the chancel, when Pentecost blooms forth in flame, the debt will be repaid, the pawn reclaimed, the fresh discovered deeps poured out in deeds of love and mercy, justice too.

On Tuesday March 29, 9:30AM - 3:30PM, several members of the Council will be attending by zoom a conference from the Lombard Mennonite Peace Center. 


Social Ministry is collecting the following personal care and first aid items for Liberia \sim

Mission Statement: We, the members of the St. John's congregation, promise to share the good news of Jesus Christ and love one another through worship and service in our homes, church, community and the world.

Vision Statement: To be welcoming people who encourage God's love in our community through our prayers, devotion, benevolence, and deeds.

The monthly meeting of St. John's Lutheran Church council was held on Thursday, February 10, 2022 at 6:30 pm in the blue room.

Present: Pastor Ela Robertson, President Carol Fultz, Ed Bilich, Joy Byler, and Deb French. Jami Zook and Nancy Penepacker were excused.

The meeting was called to order by Carol Fultz.

Devotions: Ed Bilich led devotions. The devotion schedule for 2022 is: March – Deb French April – Jami Zook May – Nancy Penepacker June – Joy Byler July & August – no meetings September – Joy Byler October – Deb French November – Jami Zook December – Carol Fultz

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the 01/24/2022 meeting were presented. A motion to accept the minutes with a correction from the January 2022 minutes in the Pastor's report: The Christmas offerings were \$732 and \$700 of that was sent to the Lewistown Red Cross Fire Fund. Also, an addition, that if St. John's had to cancel church for any reason (i.e. furnace malfunction, etc.), West Kish would allow us to have our church service at their church at our normal 9:30 a.m. time slot. With the corrections and additions, a motion to accept the minutes was made by Ed Bilich and seconded by Deb French. Motion carried.

Financial Reports:

The financial reports were presented by Ed Bilich.

St. John's – A motion to accept the church financial report was made by Joy Byler and seconded by Deb French. Motion carried.

St. John's Daycare – A motion to accept the daycare financial report was made by Joy Byler and seconded by Deb French. Motion carried.

In 2021 it was decided to give 50% of the interest/dividends gained from our investments to Mission. A motion was made by Deb French to give \$2,100 of the \$4,152.49 we gained in 2021. Joy Byler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor's report:

- Worship services: February 20th, Communion; February 27th, Transfiguration of the Lord (abbreviated service due to the congregational meeting); Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd; Palm Sunday April 10th; Easter Sunday April 17th. There will be an Ash Wednesday Prayer Vigil at West Kish and all are invited to sign up to stop in for a 15 minute time slot.
- ♦ The Discretionary Fund balance is \$1,505.04.
- ◊ Upcoming Memorial service for Ev Young on Saturday, March 19th. A luncheon will be provided by Linda Byler.
- ♦ There will be a Congregational Leaders Gatherings on Tuesday, February 15th at 6:30 p.m. at Evangelical Lutheran Church in Reedsville with Craig Miller leading.
- We will attempt to set a date for a council retreat. Pastor Ela will send an email to council members to get possible dates.
- ♦ Synod a meeting to discuss questions for interviewing candidates for new Bishop.
- ♦ Pastor was on vacation for a week recently.
- Registration for Transitional Ministry Conference cancelled in 2020 has been reinstated for July 2022.
- Long Term Planning Vision for 2022 After revising, now reviving and living our constitutional guidelines, how is what we are doing contributing to the mutual ministry of 1) pastor, council and congregation, 2) our Synod partners 3) Christ's world ministry?
- Respond in compassion, prayer and action to the cumulative impact of the pandemic on community, church, care workers, and families.
