

Now that halls and residences have opened up as Covid recedes, I encourage you to make time to drop in, open mail, read to, talk with, and share a little joy with some of these folks. If you would like an idea who to visit talk to Pastor Ela, and if you know someone you would like us reach out to, please share that as well.

Gathering with families to tend, to honor, mourn, bury and celebrate the life of loved one is a cherished part of my work with the church. They always express gratitude for all who have participated in making this life passage meaningful and easier. Recent services for Stacy Spicher and Ev Young brought together many in our community honoring the place these women and their families have held in the heart of our church.

MEMORIAL DAY observances:

Thank you to Carolyn Conner and others who helped keep the spirit and tradition of Big Valley Memorial Day alive during the last two years. This year the VFW resumes their official parade and ceremonies with Dorie Remensnyder's son, Dirk, now a Colonel in the National Guard, participating as guest speaker and Pastor Ela offering prayers of invocation and benediction.

We also thank Ron Carson, his son, family and volunteers who have honored veterans with memorials in every cemetery in the area for the recent decades. This year, St. Johns will host veterans and community members for the Service before Memorial Day on Sunday May 29. Jesus said when offering the first Last Supper "Do this in remembrance of me." We gather for this special service to honor our God and all who have served God and country.

SYNOD NEWS:

New Bishop Search

Meetings of our Synod and Conference congregational leaders and pastors recently have focused on the upcoming election of a new Synod bishop. Two essential elements of this process are:

- 1: Gathering input from church constituents about what qualities they would value in a bishop. Our church representative for instance hoped a candidate would value family and developing youth involvement through camp ministry. Shaping interview questions that will reflect this without leading the conversation has been a challenge for the committee.
2. Prioritizing the work of the Holy Spirit in the search and election process, by allowing any voting member to nominate a rostered leader anywhere in the country whom they think would be a good bishop. Anyone of you may know, or have been watching or listening to an ELCA pastor during Covid you might want to nominate. Just let Pastor Ela know and she can submit that name to the pool! The idea is that the Holy Spirit may be speaking through any one of us, bringing obvious as well as unexpected nominees to the floor.

Listening Team

On April 23 our church participated in an information gathering and 'Listening process' with the Synod to help discern the way forward. We thank the Bishop, six member team and all who have offered input in this discovery process. This is another way we listen to each other and to the Holy Spirit, by opening up avenues for conversation and discernment inviting resurrection light into the church community. The team will be reporting back to us soon.

57th Annual Auction ~ May 27 & 28, 2022**



Old Business:

- ◇ Pastor Ela will look over the Fellowship Hall policy and bring a draft to the next meeting.
- ◇ Beverly Eichhorn audited the books for the church and the daycare and they were found to be in good order.
- ◇ Ed discussed doing some changes in QuickBooks to make things a little easier to see actual balances in accounts. He will be working with Kelly on this.
- ◇ Jami will get a calendar for Kelly's office so Kelly and the pastor can mark their vacation requests on it. It will be a good way to keep track of vacations.
- ◇ Discussion continues on mini splits....Ed stated we first would have to have another 200 amp electrical box installed before we can make any decisions.
- ◇ The old metal chairs under the stage are available for people to pick up for free if they wish. If we can't get rid of all of them, we may advertise on FB, or sell them at the daycare yard sale.

New Business:

- ◇ We were notified that we would be receiving a bequest of \$50,000 from a former member, Evelyn Young. It is to be used at council's discretion.
- ◇ Our organist, Susie, is in need of a car. She is now renting every week and since the rental company is no longer open on Saturdays, she has to rent for two days. If anyone knows of a car for sale, let Susie know.
- ◇ Newsletter information must be to Kelly no later than March 23rd.
- ◇ The April meeting must be scheduled for a different date, as it falls on Maundy Thursday.
