A simple prayer

Precious words are often found tucked in the pages of an old book. They can offer us that 'god-wink' experience of words we just needed to hear, the uplift we needed at that particular moment in time. That is how this prayer was found by a young music teacher at a difficult time in her career.

Open my eyes to see what is beautiful, my mind to know what is true, and my heart to love what is good, for Jesus' sake. Amen.

The wonder of a short prayer is that it is easy to memorize. Perhaps a better way of saying that is - after reading it and saying it to ourselves for awhile, it just becomes a part of who we are, ready to lift us up and give us direction at a moment's notice. In the span of one sentence this prayer has the power to open us up *to see, to know, to love.* This in a nutshell is what Christ calls us to do.

Like many prayers this one begins with a command like 'Heal!, Save!, or Teach!' In this case it is 'Open!' What a powerful action to pray for! How many conflicts in relationships, in our churches and communities start with the unwillingness to be open to new or different ways of seeing, knowing or extending our love.

Being open means we, like an open door, are willing to step outside ourselves to see, appreciate, think about and care about people and the world that extends boundless beyond us.

God helps us do this.

In the previous newsletter and at the first Sunday after the equinox when summer officially turns to fall you were asked how you were opened up to beauty over the summer or at a special time in your life. How did you find those surprising moments of awe that seemed to affirm the presence of God?

It's often difficult to write this down. The words can not really capture the experience of knowing God in a sunset, in a hospital, in a moment with family.

But behind those simple words is a person's experience of opening up to beauty, to something larger than us, to a sense of God's presence, to a love that shines for us, speaks to us and sustains us though our days, through joys and difficulties.

As we read these words may they strengthen our sense of community and open us up to the beauty, truth and goodness God calls us to look for and live.



We are always so grateful for the work they do each year, and all for the price of lunch from the White Hall Store.














Advent 2022 St. John's and West Kish ~ The Journey to Christmas

The monthly meeting of St. John's Lutheran Church council was held on Thursday, June 9, 2022 at 6:00 pm in the blue room.

Bishop Collins presented the recommendations from the listening committee. There was some discussion with her and she then left. We appreciate all the work Bishop Collins and the listening committee did for us through this process.

Present: Pastor Ela Robertson, President Carol Fultz, Ed Bilich, Joy Byler, Deb French, Nancy Penepacker and Jami Zook.

The meeting was called to order by Carol Fultz.

Devotions: Joy Byler led devotions. The devotion schedule for 2022 is:

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the May 11, 2022 meeting were presented. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Deb French and seconded by Nancy Penepacker. Motion carried.

Financial Reports:

The financial reports were presented by Ed Bilich.

St. John's – A motion to accept the church financial report was made by Jami Zook and seconded by Deb French. Motion carried.

St. John's Daycare – A motion to accept the daycare financial report was made by Joy Byler and seconded by Nancy Penepacker. Motion carried.

Pastor's report:

WORSHIP

• Pastor Ela clarified altar helpers and communion helpers and what their roles are.

Rosalie and Gwen may help pastor Ela during the service and help distribute bread. The people that are signed up for altar care will set up the altar as usual and help distribute the wine.

Memorial Day Sunday service went well, as well as the VFW service on Memorial Day.

UPCOMING SERVICES

- June 12 Trinity Sunday no communion will honor graduates and teachers at this time.
- The pastor will be taking time off and vacation in the following manner with the noted speakers:

July 17th – 23rd: Pastor Ela will attend a Transitional Ministry Workshop. The 17th will be a communion Sunday and the guest speaker will be Pastor Randy Traxler.

July 24th – 30th : She will attend Denominational Service – Prayer Partners. The 24th guest speaker will be Gideon Tom Gresh.

July 31^{st} – August 7^{th} : She will be on vacation. Guest speaker on July 31^{st} – Pastor Randy Traxler Guest speaker on August 6^{th} – Rev. Richard Nyakaana.

MISSION:

The discretionary fund balance is: \$1,215.04.

PASTORAL CARE:

The pastor visited veterans, returning congregants, new attenders. She also led a funeral for Harry Yoder, brother of Nathan Yoder (non-member), who was buried with family members in St. John's cemetery.

MEETINGS:

Big Valley Ministerium will meet on June 14th. Meeting with the Valley View Chaplains as well. We asked that the ministerium keep us in their prayers. Synod Assembly is June 17 & 18. We will set a time to follow up on the listening team recommendations.

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

The Memorial Day Parade; There will be "Prayer at the Park" on June 18th at 10:00 a.m. at Victory Park in Lewistown. There is a meal to follow.

Committee Reports:

Cemetery - Nancy Penepacker – nothing to report

Long Range - Ed Bilich – nothing to report

Property – Ed Bilich – Ed stated the property committee would like to add one job to the sexton's duties: check outside drains on a weekly basis and sweep any leaves or debris away from them. A motion to add this job to the Sexton's job description was made by Jami Zook and seconded by Nancy Penepacker. Motion carried. Ed stated he spoke to Adam Glick and told him we accepted his bid for the new electrical boxes, however, Ed hasn't heard back from him yet. Centre Wisp is ready to install fiber line once our electric is taken care of.

Music & Worship – Jami Zook – The Memorial Day Sunday service and refreshments went great. **Social Ministry** – Carol Fultz – The mother/father brunch went very well and there was a great turnout.

Day Care – Deb French – Deb stated that they purchased two new benches that are very nice. The new air conditioners have been installed. Jim Buchanan will talk with Sylvanus Peachey on venting these air conditioners, as they are floor units. Valerie McTavish (our former daycare director), who was filling in as interim, has decided to take on the director job. Things are going very well. Penelec approved the play area extension as long as there is a double gate to get in if needed to repair anything with the pole that will be two feet outside of the fence. Ed will check with the property committee on any recommendations of who to get for the project.

Finance – Joy Byler – nothing to report

Safety – Carol Fultz – nothing to report

Staff Support – Carol Fultz – nothing to report

Christian Ed – Nancy Penepacker – nothing to report

Old Business:

- We discussed the copyright license for the church hymns to be copied. Joy Byler made a motion and Ed Bilich seconded the motion to purchase a license from CCLI (a popular copyright company). Motion carried.
- Ed stated that the internet equipment will cost us approximately \$2,000 to install. A motion was made by Joy Byler and seconded by Ed Bilich to use the monies from the Memorial Fund to cover these costs.
- Mission support Since Joe Kanagy isn't sure if he will be going to Liberia, the synod asked where we would like to direct the funds they have received for his trips. Joe's wife Raphina, will be going to Liberia in the near future and Joe has asked for that money to be directed for her expenses. Ed Bilich made a motion and Jami Zook seconded the motion to notify synod and direct the monies to help Raphina on her trip to Liberia.
- Ed Bilich wondered about where we are taking the monies out of for the Electrical box upgrade that was approved at the May council meeting. He suggested using some of the monies budgeted for the property committee. Ed Bilich made a motion and Nancy Penepacker seconded the motion to use some of the budgeted monies for the project.

New Business:

- Information for the July/August newsletter must be in the office by June 28th.
- We received an InFaith Grant in the amount of \$1,000. It was decided to put it in the bank and list as a line item in our quickbooks.
- Ed stated there was a concern from a member about possibly getting screen doors for the fellowship hall to keep air flowing through. Recently the doors were open and a bird got in and it took a while to get it out and it made a mess. Ed will speak to property committee on this item.
- Nancy Penepacker stated that the candle lighters we currently have are very old and only one works. A motion was made by Nancy Penepacker and seconded by Jami Zook to purchase two new candlelighters funded from the Memorial Fund. Motion carried. They are approximately \$170 each.
- We are checking with synod on the proper times to use the Christ Candle.
- Deb French stated that the bench outside the porch doors is really in bad shape. A motion was made by Deb French and seconded by Nancy Penepacker to purchase 2 new benches for out front to be funded from the General Fund. Motion carried.
- Bishop Collins will be retiring her position soon and there will be a celebration for her through the synod office. A motion was made and properly seconded to donate \$200 to the bishop, as she has really been a help to us during her time in office. Motion carried. It is our understanding that she stated any monetary gifts she receives pertaining to her retirement will be direct to Camp Mount Luther.
- A motion to approve the pastor's time off (see pastor's report) was made by Jami Zook and seconded by Nancy Penepacker. Motion carried.
- We discussed the listening committee results and recommendations and came up with a plan for council: Make clear job descriptions, work on communications, and have a fall council retreat; be positive and recognize if we want things to be better we may need to change. The recommendations the listening committee made will be included in the newsletter. The recommendations are based on the summary of what they heard from the participants. If anyone would like to see the results, they will be in the pastor's office, and an appointment may be made for you to see them.
- We made a tentative date of October 8th for a council retreat. Options for themes include "Healthy Congregations" curriculum materials and having a Synod representative work with us on "Mutual Ministry".
- Pastor Ela stated that Camp Mount Luther has a nice virtual program that will be available August 1st 5th and thought the daycare might be interested in using it for the children. DAY CARE: Pastor Ela shared she has talked to CML representatives about making portions of the kid centered Christian education curriculum available to the day care. This could be set up 'live' with Anne Harshbarger or the Pastor as well as through their on-line camp programs. Links to a special program for August 1st 5th was sent to Deb French. This is a free program that could be used with day care and school age students.

With there being no further discussion, the meeting was properly adjourned and closed with a prayer by Pastor Ela. Next meeting will be held on Thursday, September 8, 2022 at 6:30 p.m.
