

FROM THE PASTOR

PRAYER SONGS

During the last few months we have been incorporating a few meditative prayer songs into our liturgy. This is part of the 'Prayer Song Partners Project' that brings together Presbyterians, Lutherans, Quakers and others to share a set of short original prayers that have come through the Spirit in the form of songs. Susi has been a part of this project, expertly transcribing the songs and adding a beautiful piano/organ accompaniment to lead us in singing them together in our services. Many of you have already expressed how much you have enjoyed this. We are gradually adding to our prayer song song sheets which are available as a reusable insert to the bulletin. You are welcome to take them home to sing them and pray them on your own as well.

R-1 VISA APPLICATION: Religious Worker visa application for Seulki Susi Yoo.

A few weeks ago, during our service, I provided an update on the process we have been involved with since May applying for West Kish and St. Johns to be approved to have a non-citizen Religious Worker at our churches. This will be required so that Susi can continue to be our Music Director/organist into the future when her student visa and Curricular Professional Training work permit expires as she finishes school. With an R-1 visa approved she would continue to work with us in music ministry and could potentially after two years or more apply for citizenship. We continue to pray that God helps us in the long convoluted process that will assure Susi will continue to be a part of our worship and church family. For Susi's protection there may be a period of time when she would not be able to provide music direction for services until this work permit is approved. A heart-felt thank you to the volunteers who came to the community hall at 5:30am Friday morning to help roll potpie dough and transport it to the church. Carol and Jane Fultz out-did themselves making enough to fill 2 large roasters and 90 quart containers. The show would not have been possible without the combined efforts of so many. God willing, there will be a 12th annual show. The vendors we spoke with are looking forward to coming back again, and we will be meeting in January discuss and make plans for next year.

Chrístmas Worshíp Schedule

2022 marks the 50th anniversary of our Nativity Set. It was handmade and painted by Bernard "Bernie" and Barbara "Babs" (Stuter) Conner, and presented as a gift to St. John's in 1972. Many of us can remember it sitting behind the communion rail beside the "large, live" Christmas trees which stood in the front of the doors on the Mechanic Street side of the sanctuary. The monthly meeting of St. John's Lutheran Church council was held on Thursday, October 13, 2022 at 6:30 pm in the blue room.

Present: Pastor Ela Robertson, President Carol Fultz, Ed Bilich, Joy Byler, Deb French, and Jami Zook. Nancy Penepacker was excused.

The meeting was called to order by President Carol Fultz.
