#### **FROM the PASTOR**

#### HAPPY ST. PATRICK'S DAY!

St. Patrick was famous for teaching faith in the trinity using a three leaf clover as an illustration three leafs, one clover = three persons- Father, Son and Holy Spirit = One God. What we hear less about is St. Patrick's struggle with his own faith. His words help us to understand what we seek to do during Lent. Expressing his own weakness in faith he says: *"The Lord opened the understanding of my unbelieving heart, so that I should recall my sins."* Acknowledging that we do this so that our lack of self knowledge will not hinder our relationship with God, he adds: *"I only seek in my old age to perfect that which I had not before thoroughly learned in my youth, because my sins were a hindrance to me."* 

Do we ever outgrow having to reflect on our weaknesses, unkind words and actions which we may not even be able to admit to ourselves? Lent is a time for soul searching. A time of seeking to see beyond the clouds of our own self image and false beliefs. A time to admit it is perhaps easier to point the finger at others than to accept our own shortcomings and defenses. A time to ask God to help us see and a time to listen to the spirit speak.

As part of our Lenten Journey, our council and congregation continue to be guided by the recommendations of the Synod listening team and guides for the Ministry call process. The Guide for the Ministry Site Profile from the ELCA encourages as many people from the congregation as possible to reflect and offer insight on the future of our church. That means you! The 'MSP Guide' provides inspirational food for thought and questions for reflection to carry us through Lent and into the year. The questions may be answered for yourselves individually and for the church. I include excerpts from the 'Guide' for your own Lenten reflections.

- What is God's hope and dream for you?
- In what ways are you strong and unique?
- Would your neighborhood miss you if you were gone?

Think and pray about your sense of Mission at this time in your history and consider these three things: [*That first one is a leading question isn't it!*]

• Why do you exist, and for whom? What would someone who observes you (or the church) from the outside conclude about your sense of purpose and mission?

• What are you (or the church) clearly good at? What ministry activities bring out the best in you and seem to be valued by others?

• What does your neighborhood really need right now, and how are you helping to meet those needs?


