Specifics "Both of these will teach skills for healthy communication, how to address anxiety in the congregation and how to address negative behaviors."

Actions - Synod

People and process forward

A zoom Lombard training "Facilitating Healthy Pastor-Congregation Relations" was attended by Pastor and four council members in March

A council retreat offered by the Synod Discernment team as two one hour sessions was attended by Pastor and some Council members and particularly addressed open honest communication.

Key points - The Synod may be able to tailor trainings on this topic to our needs

Time line

Training opportunities are open to all in the congregation at any time

DAY CARE and OFFICE

Recommendation: "Intentionality in defining the relationship of the congregation with the Day Care, and the church secretary to the congregation":

Specifics

- #1 "To provide job descriptions and explanation of the mission of the Day Care,
- #2 to create policies to define that relationship, as well as the duties of the Church Secretary in regard to the Day Care,
- #3 and to define the duties of the Church Secretary in relation to her role with the congregation.
- #4 And then to make sure the policies and job descriptions are communicated to the congrega tion and Daycare personnel and families."

Actions, People responsible and progress forward

Michelle will gather materials to address #1 above and communicate it to the congregations. Carol, and Jami will meet with Kelly to review and clarify job description including specifics of responsibilities with Day Care, Congregation, and as sexton, and approximate time and schedule for each.

Time line

People hope to be working on this summer and have a report to the council and congregation this fall.

MUTUAL MINISTRY

Recommendation: "Creation of a Mutual Ministry committee that is trained in the true functioning of such a committee of the church"

Specifics: "information at www.uss-elca.org under support drop down to reconciliation. "

Members of Synod support team will work with Mutual ministry team. Important to recognize this is primarily a confidential support team and liaison for <u>both</u> pastor and congregation. It is not just for conflict management. If the committee needs to address a difficult issue the Synod team will be there to work with them.

Actions, people and progress forward

Action 1: Find one more member for the team - this could be YOU!

- This is important work in setting the climate for unity and working together in the work Christ calls us to as the church.
- Nancy Penepacker and Brenda Boring are the current members of the team, Erica due to changes in her work schedule and assignments had to resign.

Information on Mutual ministry has been distributed to congregation, participation invited, one meeting held, Synod representatives who will support the committee have been established. They are Jim Bricker and Christina.

Time line - identify additional members as soon as possible. Synod team ready to go

Covenant of Commitment

Recommendation: "Creation of a 'Covenant of Commitment to lift up a positive focus for how leadership and congregation members live with one another as the church."

Specifics

"This would include how members relate to and communicate with one another, how the congregation addresses and responds to issues raised and how congregation is committed to answering God's call to mission."

Actions

Review Our Congregational constitution and identify guidance there that is perhaps not being followed and that we may simply need to pay more attention to.

Own your opinions openly i.e. - avoid anonymous petitions etc.

Identify the 'we' or 'they', emphasize I versus 'you' or accusative language

People and progress forward

Council: A thorough review and revisions of constitution has been done in the last year and a half.

Climate is improving in several areas

Time line - Retreat leaders Jim and Christina suggested this 'Covenant' is contingent on progress in other recommendations above. Good to draft this soon and have in place for future ministry.

Physical Education Teacher: This energetic individual will oversee elementary and secondary level gym class instruction as well as secondary health instruction. Applicants must have a strong Christian foundation, be able to create age-appropriate, engaging activities, and be able to differentiate instruction to meet student needs in the area of physical fitness and health. Teaching certification and prior related teaching experience is preferred.

Learning Support Teacher: This position will support secondary level student learning needs and occasionally some elementary level needs. This individual must possess skills rooted in addressing diverse learning needs, differentiating instruction, collaborating with teachers, communicating with parents, being flexible, adapting instruction, making accommodations, and developing service plans. An understanding of the importance of confidentiality and sensitivity inherent in this type of position is expected. This teacher will work in conjunction with our in-house TIU Act 89 support teachers as a team. Teaching certification is highly desired with an emphasis in special education, and prior learning support experience is preferred.

High School Science Teacher: Applicants must have a strong Christian foundation, communication skills, solid teaching ability, eagerness to differentiate instruction to meet diverse learning needs, and a willingness to team and collaborate with fellow colleagues. Secondary science teaching certification is desired. Specialization in the Sciences and prior teaching experience is required.

High School English Teacher: Applicants must possess strong skills in language arts instruction, writing and speaking, grammar, and be well versed in literature familiarity. Teaching certification is highly desired with a focus in secondary English. Prior related teaching experience is preferred.

Middle School Teacher: This position will include teaching various levels of middle school math and science and likely be part-time. There may be additional teaching, support, and coverage opportunities as needs are determined across the school which may bring this position closer to full-time. There will be discussion on this moving forward. Applicants must possess strong communication and collaboration skills and be able to differentiate learning to meet diverse student needs. This person should have a firm understanding of middle school level mathematics and science. Teaching certification is highly desired, and former teaching experience is highly preferred.

Kindergarten Assistant Teacher: This individual will be working alongside our head Kindergarten teacher and must possess strong communication and collaboration skills necessary for a successful and seamless co-teaching/team-teaching structure. This person must work well with younger students and be able to be flexible in helping young ones adjust to school routines and expectations in a nurturing way. This teacher will follow the lead of the head teacher and be able to lead portions of the class and occasionally the whole class. Teaching certification is highly desired, and former elementary and/or early childhood teaching experience is highly preferred.

Pre-K Counts Assistant Teacher: This individual will be working half days alongside our head Pre-K Counts teacher, assisting classroom needs and helping to facilitate instruction. Applicants must meet one of the following criteria: (1) Completion of at least 2 years of full-time postsecondary study or the equivalent. (2) Possession of an associate's degree or higher. (3) Ability to meet a rigorous standard of quality and demonstration of knowledge through a formal state or local academic assessment or possession by the teacher aide of a Child Development Associate's (CDA) certificate.
