



The December congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday the 10th. Along with approving the 2024 budget and other business, we will also be electing a council representative(s). **Is God asking you to serve St. John's in this way?** Meetings begin at 6:30pm and are held the 2nd Thursday of each month with the exception of July and August (no scheduled meetings during summer), and "normally" last no longer than 1-1½ hours.

Our constitution states we can have no more than 12 or fewer than 6 representatives in order to conduct the business of the church. At this time, we have six, one whose term expires the end of December. While we can operate with six, having 2, 3 or even 4 more would be helpful, especially when members are unable to attend a meeting.




# Advent 2023 The Themes of Advent

Veteran's Day is Saturday, November 11. It was designated as a time for the American people to express their appreciation for the many veterans—past and present—who have been willing to put their lives at risk to serve our country and defend our way of life.

Brave citizens have enlisted in the armed services to preserve our God-given rights and freedoms since the Revolutionary War. But the holiday of Veteran's Day was not formally established until 1954. November 11 was chosen as the official day of remembrance because it marks the anniversary of Armistice Day when the fighting stopped on the Western front at the end of the First World War.

Veteran's Day is a holiday of gratitude and reflection. Like Memorial Day, it is a time to pay tribute to American servicemen and servicewomen, but it is not the same. Memorial Day was established to remember the fallen, those who have paid the ultimate price defending America. Veteran's Day focuses on all who have served, not just the fallen. It is important to reflect on the experiences they have gone through and the contributions they have made, as well.

Veteran's Day offers the chance to show public appreciation for our living veterans and those currently serving in the armed forces. Military personnel and their families often make sacrifices, both large and small on a regular basis, and that should not be forgotten.

### **Donations will be accepted through Monday, November 6**

#### "WOW" Gift

Doll, Soccer ball (Make sure to include a manual air pump so that the ball can be reinflated.) Stuffed animal, an outfit of clothing to wear, shoes, small musical instrument (such as a harmonica or woodwind recorder)

#### Toys

Foam ball, Kickball (Make sure to include a manual air pump so that the ball can be reinflated) Finger puppets, Slinky, Etch A Sketch, Yo-Yo, Interactive toys that include push buttons, lights, noise (include extra batteries), Jump rope, etc.

#### **Personal Items**

Comb, Hairbrush, Toothbrush, Washcloth, Bar soap, Adhesive bandages (Colorful ones can help a child be more willing to wear a bandage. Do not include liquid antibiotic ointment.) Reusable plastic containers: cup, water bottle, plate, bowl, blunt-edged utensils (Consider filling an empty container with non-liquid items such as hair bows, bracelets, sunglasses, or washcloths to maximize the space.) Blanket

#### **Clothing and Accessories**

Shoes and socks, Flip-flops, Sunglasses, Tote bag/purse, Hair bows, Jewelry and watches, flashlights (include extra batteries)


#### **Crafts, Activities and School Supplies**

Pencils, Small pencil sharpener, Colored pencils, Pencil case, Crayons, Markers, Pens, Solar calculator, Stickers, Coloring books, Picture book, Notebooks, Glue stick (Do not include liquid glue.) Small adhesive tape, Watercolor set [Finger paint palette/crayons/markers (non-liquid containers), paint brushes, canvas or paper], Playdough (Consider adding plastic cookie cutters as non-sharp utensils)

#### DO NOT INCLUDE

Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
