Dear Members of St. John's:

The Social Ministry Committee has been collecting aluminum tabs for many years, and Carolyn Conner faithfully delivers them to the collection site. She has shared the following information which provides more detail on the program and how it has helped the families with hospitalized children. There is a container on the old organ bench outside the coatroom area for aluminum tab donations.

#### **ALUMINUM TAB COLLECTION PROGRAM**

When Everyone "PULLS" Together, You Can Make a Difference!



You can help support the Ronald McDonald Houses of Central Pennsylvania (RMHC-CP) by saving the tabs you pull from canned beverages and other **aluminum** cans. We can only accept aluminum tabs, so if the tab **does not** stick to a magnet – it's aluminum! (*Please note, we cannot accept tabs from tennis ball cans*). Funds generated help support RMHC-CP programs.

Over \$278,000 has been raised since 1996 by recycling over 629,000 pounds of tabs!

#### WHY ALUMINUM TABS?

Our partner, Consolidated Scrap Resources, Inc., buys the tabs and sends a check to us! They generously donate their pick-up and handling services, bringing in vital funds that help keep families together.

#### WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE ALUMINUM TAB PROGRAM?

ANYONE! Many schools support this project because it provides a terrific opportunity for children to get involved and make a genuine contribution to their community. Hospitals, service clubs and also participate in this easy program.

#### WHY NOT THE WHOLE CAN?

ALUMINUM tabs are clean, compact, easy to collect and the high-grade aluminum in the tab has a higher recycling value than the aluminum in the rest of the can.

#### **HOW MUCH IS AN ALUMINUM TAB WORTH?**

The price of aluminum changes on a regular basis depending on the supply and demand. On average, we receive .40 cents per pound of aluminum tabs. It takes around 1,400 tabs to equal 1 pound.

#### DO I NEED TO COLLECT A CERTAIN AMOUNT OR COUNT THE ALUMINUM TABS?

No. although some schools make a math or science project out of collecting a million, we'll take as many as you gather.

#### DO I NEED TO COLLECT THE ALUMINUM TABS IN A SPECIAL CONTAINER?

We recommend washing and reusing plastic containers with large openings for collecting and storing your tabs. Please do not use plastic soda bottles or milk jugs because they're hard to empty! We'd love to give you RMHC-CP tab stickers to put on your container to encourage tab donations. 
