About a month ago, as I was rearranging a few shelves in my library, I discovered my high school yearbooks that I had put away in the far corner of the room. As I was leafing through them year by year, my eye caught the comment that my high school Latin teacher, Mr. Carl L. Kauffman, wrote in my senior yearbook. "TEMPUS FUGIT" is what he wrote over his picture. "Time flies" in English. He had that right. It seemed like just yesterday that I had two years of Latin in Ninth and Tenth grades and there I was, graduating from high school four years later. If it was true for me that time flies back then, it is even truer for me to say that now.

As this year closes and we begin another new year, it seems like only yesterday that we were starting year 2023. And now, another year has come and gone. My father used to say that the older you are the faster it seems that the years go by.

What are we to make of time and its passage? In the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes (3:1-13), it eloquently proclaims that there is a time to be born and a time to die, a time for peace and a time for war (I don't like the war part of it!), a time to laugh and a time to cry. Ecclesiastes says that for everything under heaven there is just the right time. But just before all this talk in Ecclesiastes about just the right time, the author says that ONLY GOD KNOWS WHEN THAT RIGHT TIME IS!

God has indeed given us a sense of the passage of time, the passage of an old year and the beginning of a new one. One of my seminary professors was fond of saying that "God makes time for us." By that he meant that God is eternal and as the Psalmist says, "A thousand years are but as a moment for God. A thousand years is but the blink of an eye in God's time. The gospel, the good news is that God delights in taking time with us and for us. He cares deeply about the days of our lives, our ups and downs and our sideways. When the time had fully come, God sent forth His Son, Jesus Christ to live among us as we are, to know what it means to be a human being and all that that entails. The timing of Christ's birth, however, was peculiar to God's timing.

As we begin this new year, by God's grace there is still TIME for us and we are to use our time wisely and not waste it, to serve as Christ has served us, to give ourselves in words and deeds of love as Christ has so loved us. No one of us knows the length and breadth of our days. Just so, as we begin this new year that stands before us and are granted God's gracious gifts, one of which is time, may the journey of our days ahead be filled with praise to God in Christ for the possibilities of service that await us, with God's promise that He also journeys along with us. The time is always right for us to give of ourselves for the sake and needs of others.

May this new year be one that for you is filled with God's richest blessings! Happy New Year!


Cancelling Sunday/Special Church Services
