PASTOR'S PAGE FOR THE APRIL NEWSLETTER

Everyone above a certain age, in the United States at least, can remember where they were when they heard that President John F. Kennedy had been assassinated or when the attack upon America on 9/11 happened. When President Kennedy was shot, I was in the 7th grade and heard about it from my home room teacher and upon hearing the news, we were immediately dismissed to our homes. Karen and I were watching the morning news on television on 9/11 when suddenly the world was shown the horrifying smoke billowing from the twin towers in New York City.

Most of us remember clearly the precise moment when something startling or amazing happens to us. I remember well my wedding day and the days in which each one of our three sons was born into the world. I remember being, for once in my life, completely at a loss for words! A whole new world was opening up in front of me and I knew it, although I could not adequately put the words to my thoughts of this realization.

It should not be difficult for us to understand the mixture of terror and astonishment and joy that gripped the women who went to the tomb on Easter morning. St. Mark and St. Luke explain that the women had brought spices, since the burial of Jesus had taken place in too much haste before the start of the Sabbath on Good friday evening to allow time to wrap Jesus' body in a proper way. St. Matthew simply says that the women had come to look at the tomb. At this point in the story, they simply seem to be mourners; just wanting to be there, near Jesus, to pour out their sorrow with as much peace and quiet as possible. But peace and quiet was the last thing they got! St. Matthew's graveside scene is easily the most dramatic of all the gospels. There is an earthquake, the guards in front of the tomb are stunned into a swoon and the women hear messages about Jesus going on ahead on them into Galilee.

The God who remained apparently silent on Good friday is now having the last word. God is answering the unspoken questions of Jesus' followers and the spoken question of Jesus himself from the cross. Though they were thunderstruck with amazement and fear, there is every reason to suppose that they remembered that day for the rest of their lives. You can almost hear them saying to anyone who would listen: "I know how amazing this has to sound to you...I almost could not believe it myself, but Jesus is risen from the dead!"

What is central here is that those at the tomb needed to see Jesus, and see the risen Lord they did! However, just seeing him was not the end but rather the beginning. It led to a commissioning of new work, a new life, a ministry that was given to them and a realization that all that Christ had said to them before his death will indeed come true. Because Jesus is risen from the dead, death no longer holds any grip over anyone of us.

You and I cannot meet Jesus in the same way the women and the disciples did on Easter morning and thereafter before his ascension. One day we will see him, when we stand before him face to face; but that day yet awaits us. What those who witnessed the empty tomb and the risen Lord in person on Easter learned is that he is the one chosen by God through whom death itself is defeated and that because he is risen from the tomb, we too who belong to him shall likewise be raised in his very likeness. Easter blessings to you and yours!



Daycare February Report

Enrollment:

46/48 (2 School age are drop-in care as needed) I have enrollment started for PreK Counts for Fall 2024 as well as Summer 2024.

Tuition

Effective January 1st all late payments are being charged a late fee.

Staff:

9 staff

We had one staff member quit due to ongoing health problems, and another decided to babysit in her home, so she could also home-school her son. Fortunately, I have been able to hire another full-time person, who originally worked here several years ago, and have another starting part-time. Both will be starting the middle of February. We still need additional staff, and I am actively searching for and interviewing qualified individuals.

Snacks:

Parents have been providing snacks. Even though parents are donating and doing their part we still need to feed the children snacks 2x/a day. The daycare still needs to help provide one snack/day to help.

Classroom Supplies:

We were blessed with monetary gifts from the Thrift and Gift and Sharp Shopper last November and December. We are purchasing equipment/furnishings to open the classroom beside the infant room, along with needed classroom supplies/toys to comply with STARS. Keystone STARS is a HUGE program we are part of and often where we receive most of our grant monies from.

Fundraising:

Adding fundraisers to see what we are going to do next. Families have been adding to the summer yard sale items on the stage. We ask church members who may have items in good usable condition they no longer want or need to consider donating them to our yard sale.

STARS:

We are getting ready for another review in April.

DHS:

Inspection will be in May. We are always in a state of readiness because she could show up at any time of the year. Some physical/cosmetic things need to be done before May; raking mulch, painting some chipped paint, etc.

PreK Counts:

I have already started our waiting list for the Fall. We are at full capacity for this year. We passed our PreK Counts review!!!!

Grants:

I applied for and received a Health and Wellness grant. Grant money received will need to be used in a very specific manner to ensure that the money is used productively. Any grant money received needs to be used for very specific uses. This is per grant stipulations.
