

Most of the antiques in our home, besides myself, tend to be treasures which have been handed down from our families. One of the family heirlooms which I highly prize is an old lantern that my father, so I am told, used to light his path from the family farm house to the barn where his daily chores awaited him. That old fashioned lantern is a humble little light. By today's standards I would imagine that light seemed very dim indeed and cast its light but a little distance. One thing can be said of those old lanterns. They gave sufficient light for the next step that needed to be taken.

If you think seriously about life, one could be led to ask, "But isn't that really all the light that one needs...enough for the next step?" The answer to that, I believe, is "Yes!" God does not reveal our life plans all at once. I very much doubt that we could handle it if God did! God does, however, reveal as much as we are capable of receiving.

The Bible does not fall completely open at any single moment. In fact, the most seasoned student of the Bible must live with its many mysteries still. But the Scriptures do shed light for the next step of the journey. The Bible as God's holy Word will yield a daily light of truth and a daily light of strength that you and I so desperately need. We are called to follow the Lord even where and when we cannot fully see the ending and by carrying the lantern of God's Word we can rest assured that our pathways will be illuminated.

The Psalmist who wrote the 119th psalm says in part: "Your Word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105). This illumination of which the psalmist speaks has been given most fully to us when Jesus Christ came into the world. Jesus brought the true light of God into a world where many people walked in darkness; whether it was the darkness caused by disease, hatred, pain, loneliness, or death. Everywhere Christ walked, he brought light and life to people, some of whom had lived in darkness for so long they didn't even realize how dark their world was!

The Gospel of John begins so wonderfully when it is said of Christ: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was in the very beginning with God; all things were made through Him, and without Him was not anything made that was made. In Him was life and the life was the LIGHT of humanity. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it. The true light that enlightens every person was coming into the world. And to all who believed in Him, he gave power to become the children of God" (John 1:1-5,9.12).

We are indeed the children of God and we live by faith that the darkness of this world will give way to Christ's own brilliant light. May the light of Christ's love guide your steps in the way of peace and hope and joy throughout these coming summer months!

Daycare June Report

Enrollment:

39

Attendance always decreases after preschool and Pre-K counts graduation, and increases again in the fall when school resumes. We have had six families request school-age summer care.

Tuition

Tuition will be increased again effective Monday, September 2. We are in the process of reviewing our rates and will be sending letters to families in the next 2 weeks to give them adequate notice.

Staff:

11 staff ~ 2 new staff were hired and began in May, along with 1 (summer only) staff (2nd summer person in the next few weeks, waiting on paperwork) to help with school age, vacations and requested days off.

Snacks:

Healthy snacks are expensive to purchase, and parents do help to supply some. We welcome donations of fruit, crackers, juice, milk, cereal, eggs, cereal bars, and other food items.

Classroom Supplies:

Hoping to use some of the yard sale proceeds to help purchase classroom and custodial supplies for the 24-25 school year.

Fundraising:

The annual yard sale will be held end of July or beginning of August. Donations are still needed, and can be placed on or in front of the stage.

Keystone STARS

We passed our Keystone STARS review and remain at a STAR 3 level. There are 4 levels. We would need to hire more staff with early childhood (or related) degrees in order to obtain a level 4. That is challenging in rural areas, especially the ability to pay a comparable wage.

DHS:

We passed our inspection, but there were a few things we were cited for, which we either have corrected, or are in the process of correcting.

Pre-K Counts:

Pre-K is finished for the school year, and will resume again the end of August. We are blessed to 9 of our 10 spots for the fall filled, so we only have 1 available opening remaining.
