Several years ago our second son was married in Cape May, New Jersey. Prior to the entrance of the bride accompanied by her father, our oldest grandson who was ring bearer for the occasion, entered the congregation wearing a sign around his neck which read: "Uncle Chris, here comes your bride!" The announcement had been made that the bride was about to make her entrance. Having been announced in the way in which the bride was announced, we waited with anticipation for her arrival. We had waited long enough for this moment and now the time had finally come to pass.

The four weeks before Christmas is marked by the Advent season. Advent is a time of waiting as Christians prepare for the celebration of Christ's FIRST coming to earth, born of Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem long centuries ago. While we wait for the arrival of Christmas day however, our hearts and minds are to be directed to Christ's SECOND coming at the end of time. Christians live in-between times. The first coming of Christ's birth was foretold by Israel's great prophets centuries before. This was at a time when Rome ruled the world and on a dark and cold night in Bethlehem two thousand years ago Christ was given to us as God's gift of our salvation. We are to await his final return which is yet to come at a time which no one knows except Almighty God and Him alone.

I suspect that most of us have no difficulty knowing the feeling of anticipation which comes in the month of December when the house needs decorated, gifts need to be purchased, cookies and cakes need baking, and Christmas cards need to be sent to close friends and family. If anything, there is usually the great let down once Christmas day has arrived and we wish we could hold on to that feeling of anticipation, joy and excitement for a longer period of time.

Waiting with great anticipation and excitement in between the time of Christ's birth and His expectant return in the unknown future is more difficult. Perhaps that is why Jesus says: "Therefore keep awake for you know not when the Master of the house will come, in the evening, or midnight, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly" (Mark 13:35-37).

I would hope that this year and always we could hold fast to the same sense of joy and anticipation which I felt when my grandson announced the arrival of my son's bride at the event for which we had waited so patiently for so long. There is a double message to Advent as we find ourselves between the gift of God given to us in this mangered child in Bethlehem long ago and the future fullness of this gift of the Christ at the end of time. In this Advent season of preparation and anticipation and this joyous Christmas season of His birth, may God's blessings be given to you and yours and may the love of Christ find birth in your hearts and homes.

Staff:

8 staff ~ We have interviewed and are planning to hire two individuals, one full-time and the other part-time. Currently waiting on their NSOR (Sex Offender) clearances.

Snacks:

A local church reached out and requested a list of snack items they could help to provide as part of their community outreach.

Classroom Supplies:

Sharp Shopper blessed us with a \$2,500 donation which we are using to purchase some of the more expensive classroom equipment which needs to be replaced.

Fundraising:

The calendar fundraiser brought in just over \$4,000.00, with \$3,000.00 directed to the security camera expense. The Gift Show is scheduled for Friday, November 29 and Saturday, November 30.

Keystone STARS

All centers in the program will be receiving a grant to be used towards teacher retention in the form of bonuses and wage increases. We were recently informed it will not be paid out until the end of December.

DHS:

United Way Day of Caring was postponed here due to the rainy weather. Since most of the work was outside and included painting, we are looking to reschedule a time for them to come in the spring, before our May DHS inspection.
